



## **Embassy Interviews – Recommended Documents**

Below are documents we recommend you bring to your embassy interview.

**Before your interview please check with the U.S. embassy in your country for the required documents, as each country may vary.**

- I-20 issued by New America School
- Acceptance letter from New America School
- Proof of I-901 (SEVIS fee) payment
  - Pay at <https://fmjfee.com>
  - Print out your receipt
- Passport
  - Must be valid for at least six months beyond your intended stay in the United States
- DS-160 confirmation page
  - Complete DS-160 online: <https://ceac.state.gov/genniv/>
  - Print confirmation page
- Passport photos
  - Learn more about photo requirements: <https://travel.state.gov/content/visas/en/general/photos.html>
- Transcripts and diplomas
  - From all previous institutions
- Financial evidence
  - Shows you or the person who is paying for your education has sufficient funds to cover tuition and living expenses during the period of your intended stay.
  - For example:
    - Bank statements
    - If you or your sponsor owns a business, bring the business registration, license, and tax documents, as well as original bank books and/or statements.
    - Tax documents
- Visa application fee
  - Receipt/proof of payment
  - Review instructions on the U.S. embassy's website for your country
- Evidence of ties to your home country.
  - House
  - Job
  - Family
  - Financial connections
- Proof of health insurance – recommended
